







Asheville City Commuter-Adjusted Population, 2021






• In a city of approximately 94,000 residents, daytime population change due to commuting (does not include visitors) is estimated to increase 42% - 56%.

 Domestic in-migration has been the primary driver of population growth.






Median Age, 2021

Median Age by Metro



Asheville Metro Age Composition (% of Population)




ESRI Diversity Index by Metro

• A measure that shows the likelihood that two persons, chosen at random from the same area, belong to different races or ethnic groups where 0 = No Diversity and 100 = Complete Diversity. Example: the broader NYC Metro was 82 on this index in 2022.




Real GDP % Change, 2016-2021



Employment Change %, 2017-2022




2022 Employment Distribution by Major Industry






Asheville Metro Employment Change by Major Industry

- 3.1% was the second lowest annual average on record for the Asheville Metro.


Annual Average Unemployment Rate 2022




Asheville Metro compared to the state:


Asheville Metro Home Price and Supply




